## Counting

While eating, you can say, "You have five grapes. If you eat one, how many are left?" While dressing, "You have two shoes. Let's wear them both!" Create a simple number line on the floor using tape. Ask the child to jump or walk to specific numbers. Practice recognizing numbers by pointing them out in books, on clocks, or other everyday items. Practice writing numbers. Start with tracing activities before moving to freehand writing.

## More or Less

In the picture you have to count the objects and find the difference in some picture you will find more objects and other less. Select the more and select the less. Start counting.

Regularly review the numbers and incorporate them into daily conversations. If a child asks questions or shows curiosity, use that opportunity to explore numbers further. Remember that repetition is the key at this age. Be patient and offer plenty of encouragement. Incorporating these playful and interactive methods can make learning numbers an enjoyable experience for children. By weaving numbers into everyday activities and play, you can ensure a strong foundation for future mathematical understanding.
